## Fogging Instructions for disinfectant and antimicrobial applications

## PLEASE BE SURE TO READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE YOU APPLY THE DISINFECTANT AND ANTIMICROBIAL SOLUTIONS

## Initial steps:

- If you are using a battery operated sprayer or fogger, make sure it is fully charged the night before you use it.
- If you are using a corded sprayer or fogger make sure you have sufficient extension cords available.
- Make sure you have enough chemicals to complete the job. Using a basis of 1 gallon to cover 2000 square feet

## Fogging (Instructions are the same for disinfectant and antimicrobial applications)

- 1. Fill the first fogger with the chemical formula.
- 2. Start on one end of the room you are about to fog.
- 3. When you fog, make sure the fogger is set for the finest or smallest droplets if it has an adjustable setting.
- 4. You want to make sure all people and pets are not going to be in the rooms you are treating during the treatment and for a minimum of 1 to 2 hours after treatment.
- 5. You should also cover or remove plants during treatment. If you cannot remove or cover plants, make sure not to spray directly onto plants.
- 6. You do not spray on tapestry, or paintings without a glass covering. The rule of thumb is if you would not spray water on it you do not spray the products on it.
- 7. You should start on items covering and along the walls first. You go around the whole room covering the walls and wall coverings.
- 8. You should move in a steady up and down or side to side motion making sure to cover all surfaces. The wand of the fogger should be in continuous motion so you do not over spray. The goal is to get the spray to envelope all the surfaces in front of it. If you see droplets forming you are probably moving too slow. You can wipe off excess liquid of disinfectant or antimicrobial spray.
- 9. Coverage should include furniture including couches and chairs, tables, shelves, cabinets, walls and floors.
- 10. Make sure to do high touch points such as light switches, door knobs and handles, thermostats, alarm controls, lamps, remote controls, phones, faucets, drawer handles, monitor, keyboard and mouse for computers and any other areas where you suspect people touch regularly
- 11. Electronics can be sprayed but very lightly. You do not want a high concentration of liquid to get on the inside of electronic devices including computers, stereos, dvd players, televisions and like items.
- 12. Lastly you do the center of the rooms in a side to side spray on the floors.
- 13. The disinfectant takes less than 10 minutes to kill the germs on surfaces. You can start the antimicrobial application immediately after the 10 minutes has passed.
- 14. After the application process is done, make sure you empty any chemicals still in the foggers back into their containers.

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
